



THE FISHING INDUSTRY ACT

The Fishing Industry (Special Fishery Conservation Area) Regulations, 2012

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by section 25 of the *Fishing Industry Act*, the following Regulations are hereby made: –

Citation. 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Fishing Industry (Special Fishery Conservation Area) Regulations, 2012.

**Interpreta-
tion.** 2. In these Regulations –
“alien species” means a species, subspecies or lower taxon, introduced outside its natural distribution and includes any part, gamete, seeds, eggs or propagules of that species which may survive and reproduce;
“alien invasive species” means an alien species that threatens biological diversity;
“special fishery conservation area” means the areas specified in regulation 3.

**Fishing in

4. – (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3), no person shall fish in a special fishery conservation area except in accordance with –

(a) a licence issued by the Licensing Authority under the provisions of the Act; and

(b) the provisions of the directions issued by the Minister under regulation 5.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to fishery inspectors or public officers designated as the Licensing Authority under section 4 of the Act.

(3) A person who contravenes paragraph (1), commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction before a Resident Magistrate to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars.

Directions.

5. The Minister may give directions for fishing in a special fishery conservation area for the purpose of the management, control and conservation of fish in that area, and such directions shall specify –

(a) the special fishery conservation area or part thereof to which the direction relates; and

(b) the terms and conditions for fishing in that area, including –

- (i) identifying the species of fish to be fished;
- (ii) specifying the method of fishing and the manner in which fishing is to be undertaken;
- (iii) specifying the purpose for the fishing, such as fishing to obtain specimens for scientific, educational or other conservation related purpose;
- (iv) the terms and conditions under which fishing of a particular species of fish is permitted, including fishing seasons and times, the number, sex and size of the specimens;
- (v) whether fishing may be undertaken to gather live specimens of fish and the method of gathering, receiving, keeping and transporting live specimens;
- (vi) for the culling of alien invasive species;
- (vii) for the disposal of specimens fished from a special fishery conservation area, including the sale of live or dead specimens;
- (viii) the gathering of specimens for the purpose of rearing, breeding or otherwise propagating fish and the conditions under which such rearing, breeding or propagating may be undertaken; and
- (ix) such terms and conditions as the Minister may think fit to ensure that fishing in a special fishery conservation area and the specimens fished are not utilized in a manner inconsistent with the eradication of alien invasive species and the

conservation of indigenous fish populations in a special fishery conservation area.

Offence to introduce fish to, propagate fish from special fishery conservation area.

6. – (1) No person shall knowingly –

- (a) introduce any species into any special fishery conservation area; or
- (b) transport, purchase, receive, keep, rear, breed or propagate specimens of any fish from a special fishery conservation area,

in contravention of a direction issued under regulation 5.

(2) A person who contravenes paragraph (1) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction before a Resident Magistrate to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars.

Revocation. Fifteenth Schedule.

7. Every Order specified in the Fifteenth Schedule to these Regulations is hereby revoked.

Starting at Point A, a water-based mark, along the first elbow on deep edge at the Pedro Bank, at coordinates N16° 58.900' and W77° 47.279', the boundary shall proceed as follows –

- (a) from Point A, the boundary runs in a straight line to Point B, a water-based mark at the 20-25 meter contour depth, and at coordinates N17° 00.730' and W77° 48.426';
- (b) from Point B, the boundary continues to Point C, a water-based mark, at coordinates N17° 00.136' and W77° 49.918' to include the Black Rock bottom habitats and at similar depth;
- (c) from Point C, the boundary runs to Point D, a water-based mark, to include sections of Black Rock bottom habitat, at coordinates N16° 59.625' and W77° 49. 995';
- (d) from Point D, the boundary runs straight to Point E, a water-based point at coordinates N16° 58.947' and W77° 49.469' similar habitat as above;

- (e) from Point E, the boundary runs to Point F, a water-based mark at the second elbow along the deep edge at Pedro Bank, at coordinates N16° 58.168' and W77° 47.283';
- (f) from Point F, the boundary runs in a straight line back to Point A.

Starting a Point A, a land-based mark at Deadman Hole, with geographical coordinates $18^{\circ} 01' 35.957''$ N and $77^{\circ} 52' 7.315''$ W, and then proceeding –

Starting at Point A, a land-based mark at Carbarita Point with geographical coordinates $17^{\circ} 50' 43.753''$ N and $77^{\circ} 02' 21.231''$ W, and then proceeding as follows –

- (a) from Point A, the boundary shall run through the mangrove wet land, following the north-western border of the reef to Point B, a water-based mark with geographical coordinates $17^{\circ} 51' 23.348''$ N and $77^{\circ} 00' 41.346''$ W;

- (e) from Point F, the boundary shall follow the contours of Little Goat Island along the north-eastern border to Point G, a land-based mark on the southern side of the Island, with geographical coordinates $17^{\circ} 52' 59.194''$ N and $77^{\circ} 04' 30.913''$ W;

- (f) from Point G, the boundary shall run straight in an easterly direction to Point H, a land-based mark on Great Goat Island, with geographical coordinates $17^{\circ} 52' 08.223''$ N and $77^{\circ} 03' 28.563''$ W;
- (g) from Point H, the boundary shall run along the north-eastern coastline on Great Goat Island to Point I, a land-based Point on Kerby Bend, with geographical coordinates $17^{\circ} 51' 46.668''$ N and $77^{\circ} 02' 57.436''$ W; and
- (h) from Point I, the boundary shall run across the Bogue Channel back to the starting point.

- (c) from Point C, the boundary shall follow the contours of the coastline to include Walker Bay, Coquar Bay and Manatee Bay, back to the starting point.
